








(D)LIVELIHOOD INTERVENTION













(1) WADI

In the tribal & upland dominated are of Keonjhar, Dhenkanal & Maurbhanj for the sustainable livelihood approach we are going for plantation based livelihood programs. Initially we are finalize the plantation field with village level discussion then we prepared the Detail Project Report and share with community for its planning approach to final the implementation work is. The Promotion of sustainable livelihood opportunities for participating tribal communities through remunerative self-employment through establishing WADI (small orchard locally called BADI) model. Projects are ongoing with the support of NABARD, District Mineral foundation (DMF), MGNREGA of Horticultuer Department, DCCD Cochin.

Specific objectives:

- Effective utilization of available land, water and manpower resources of selected tribal families through participatory approach.
- Implementation of environmentally friendly income generating activities.
- Development though peoples organizations.
- Participation by women in development process and their empowerment.
- Demonstrative merits of a WADI model for replicating the same by various developmental agencies and also adoption of technology by the other farmers in the project area.

Specific interventions will be focused on:

- WADI project will ensure that the socio economic status of people of the area develops in the following ways:
- Strengthening local community institutions
- Establishment of orchard of the selected fruit crops as a foundation economic activity.
- Utilization of border of the orchard for planting of short term crop and economical species to meet the annual expenditure.

- Adoption of in situ soil conservation measures to arrest further degradation of soil and shaping of the land to make it suitable for establishment of orchard.
- increasing the soil health status through organic approach & soil conservation measures
- Development of water resources individually or on community basis to provide protective irrigation for fruit plants. The emphasis is on dry land horticulture, providing irrigation during the critical period by adopting the time-tested water saving pitcher irrigation technique.
- Adoption of improved farming techniques, by capacity building of the participating farmers through technology interventions, training, and exposure visits etc. to improve the crop productivity, production and quality of the produce.
- Introducing income generation programmers for women groups and try to enhance the food and nutrition security of the house hold level.

(2) Tasar Host Tree Plantation:

In this year the tasar host tree plantation project is initiate in 7 GP of Harichandanpur Block with the financial support of District Mineral Foundation (DMF)Keonjhar, MGNREGA with the technical support of sericulture Department.

The objectives of this Project will be as follows:

- The core objective behind promotion of Tasar host plant raising programme is to develop 300 hectare of Arjuna and Asan plantation on revenue waste land in mining affected villages of Harichandanpur block of Keonjhar District to provide livelihood earning to 300 families from tasar silk worm rearing.
- This project will ensure the enhancement of socio economic status of the people in the following ways:
- By providing the usufruct right on the tasar host plantation raised under the project
 @ 1 ha per family so that the families can use the plants to take up the silk worm rearing to increase their earning.
- Improve the soil & moisture health status through organic approach & soil conservation measures.
- Ensuring irrigation through water resources development for life saving irrigation of the plants and taking up intercropping where ever possible.
- To promote sustainable, participatory livelihood development in the mining affected areas of Keonjhar through plantation of Tasar host trees
- To create dependable plantation asset base for Tasar rearer in a cluster approach in the Tasar growing areas of the district
- To improve the standard of living of beneficiaries' families by enhancing
- access to natural resources leading to reduction in poverty
- To increase plantation cover in the district by utilizing revenue wasteland
- To rejuvenate the local natural environment in an integrated and comprehensive manner
- To build and strengthen local institutions which would enable the communities to be partners in programme execution and bringing improvement in their social and economic status

The TVS are actually "owns" the project and is responsible for the planning, implementation, monitoring and maintenance of the project with guidance from SHRISTI. Assistant Director Sericulture, Keonjhar is the conveyor of the project. The material and HR component of the project is funded by DMF whereas the entire labor component was converged from MGNREGS.

(3) Odisha Millet Mission:

This Special program for promotion of Millet in Tribal area of Keonjhar, Odisha is ongoing with the support of District Mineral foundation, Agriculture department & WASSAN.

The objectives of this Project will be as follows:

- Increasing house hold consumption of millets by about 25% to enhance household nutrition security and to create demand for millet.
- Promoting Millet Processing enterprises at panchayat and Block level to ease processing at households and for value added markets.
- Improving productivity of Millet crop systems and make them profitable.
- Developing Millets Enterprises and establishing market linkage to rural/urban markets with focus on women entrepreneurs.

This is projected at 56 villages of Champua Block. This is the third year of our implementation in this period we are addressing the following progress.

- 795 no of Farmer raised millets in 388.48 hectare of land. 670 Qtl of millets were produced.
- Around 65 Community nurseries were developed.
- Trainings organized by team for creating of awareness & motivation.
- Arranged awareness Ratha for mobile awareness
- Street play on millet was arranged

operating the joint partnership with BRLF & Selected NGOS in 75 blocks of 14
highland districts. SHRISTI being a partner has been implementing the initiatives at
5 tribal & upland dominated Blocks of Keonjhar, Mayurbhanj, Dhenkanal, Anugul,
Chompua & Sundargarh.

- To trigger growth in farm sector with the objective of sustainably doubling the income of 1 Lakh small and marginal farmers. (16006 families in 6 blocks of 5 District).
- To establish the model of Agriculture Production Cluster (APC) in 3 backward blocks as an effective method to organize production system and services of markets

Progress of the Project

• During this year we are successfully formed & linked the 147 Producer Group with OLM .For successful operation of PG programme the Udyagmitras were selected by written examination & some places finalised by PG members in meeting process. We are finalized the winner crop after conducted a market study & taking priority to

Farmers practice also finalized its POP & PG wise Business plan the same was oriented to all members. The PG wise DPR & Assessment report were done with the participation of PG members and was submitted to OLM for release of IB &CB fund. In this project we focused in PG formation, Vegetable cultivation, Plantation, NPM, Irrigation, Livestock, Infrastructure development & farm mechanization. The yearly progress ia as below.

(5) Case Study-TUNKIBURU PRODUCER GROUP

Rangamatia & Bahaldavillage two villages of Badapathara Gram Panchayat , Khunta block of Mayurbhani District. Rangamatia & Bahalda are two tribal villages, in Rangamatia village total house hold 92 out of which 52 HH are Santal and 40 HH are Bhumija, in Bahalda 97 HH are Bhumija and 3 HH are Santal. Rangamatia & Bahalda villages are situated on the base of The Similipal forest, 15 Km form Block office (Khunta) and 43 Km District head quarter(Baripada). These two villages are full of natural resource. A very famous waterfall named "Tunki Buru" waterfall is only 3 Km from the village. The village is densely covered with natural resources along with reserve forest, dry nala. Paddy cultivation is the foremost livelihood option for them, secondly they depends upon NTFP like sal leaf, mahua, honey, firewood etc &some HH's depend upon livestock.

"SHRISTI" a state level NGO stated work through Agriculture Production Cluster in the year 2019 and formed a producer group named "Tunkiburu Producer group" with 70 women member. In the year 2019 Kharif season 19 members of the PG started vegetable cultivation with 7.5 Acres of land (Brinjal, Ridge gourd & Bitter gourd) and earned an average income of Rs. 25000/-. After that the confidence was built among the PG members and gradually the number of farmer and area increased. In the year 2020-21 SHRISTI introduced single line trellis with Bitter gourd and Ridge gourd as winner crop in synchronized way. Total 28 farmers are involved with 22 acres of land and earned an average of Rs. 80000/-. This year PG members were focused on synchronized planning & marketing. This year 71 members were involved in the Kharif season and cultivated 60 acres of land and earned an average of Rs. 90000/-.

This year many buyers from Balasore, Baripada and Bhadrak were coming to these villages for purchasing the produces. The PG members were selling their produces at village level after bargaining with vendors and were accepting the highest offer and also sold in Baripada & Udala mandi through Similipal Farmers producer Company. Now these villages have created their own identification for bitter gourd, Ridge gourd & community marketing system. Now various Government departments are supporting the PG member to enhance their income. ITDA supporting Seed, Fertilizer and pesticide, 30 vegetable crates supported by ATMA, 6 Dug well and 1 farm pond from MGNREGA and 31 farmers benefited through RKVY trellis from Horticulture department. Also ITDA department committed for 1 power weeder and 3 power sprayers and 2 Deep Bore well from OMBADC through Horticulture department.

Now 4 PG members purchased new motorcycle, 1 Tractor, 1 power tiller, 5 pump sets are in the PG. 26 PG members using smart phone and 9 members children are studying in private school. Due to lower price of vegetables better marketing and crop diversification is a challenge and round the year irrigation for all is also a big challenge.







(6) Women Collective Anchored Integrated Second Chance Education and Vocational Learning Programme

This is our 2nd Year engagement in this project and it has been implemented at 2 Blocks of Dhenkanal District with the Support of UNWOEN and PRADAN.

Objective:

- Economic Empowerment of women
- SHG, VO, CLF& Federation will be at centre for implementing and carry forward the development process.
- Create 500 women farmers and 50 women entrepreneurs at CLF level.
- Incremental income of household up to 50000 per annum.
- Enhance income Rs 800/- from 1 decimal of land in commercial vegetable crop.
- Ensure income Rs 20000/- from goat farming with a ideal herd size of 8-10.
- Develop/create Village cadre or Expert

Activities Undertaken:

- 3 times vegetable Cultivation and application of modern technology method
- Linkages with Line Dpt. for assistance and support and subsidies on farm machinaries and goat health services.
- Market linkages of vegetable and goat selling
- Planning exercise of Khariff, Rabi & summer by the local CRP
- Maintaining crop rotation and pop.
- Organizing village level goat health camp with the help of Vetenary Department.
- Regular de-warming & Vaccination ensure by local institution.

(7) Sustainable Livelihood Program for PVTG's

This is the 3rd year of this project, this is designed with the ultra poor people are PVTG's of Nagada location of Jajpur district with the partnership with Trickle up where SHRISTI is engaged in implementing promotion of Sustainable Livelihood – Agriculture and Natural Resource Management, good Governance and People's Participation for vulnerable communities, among the PVTG community whereas we committed for facilitating behavior change process and field team for implementing programme for 135 HHs in Nagada (Block- Sukinda, District-Jajpur, State-Odisha) .The objective of this partnership is to increase focus on the issues of ultra-poverty (includes PVTGs) and inclusion of the families living under extreme poverty in the social, financial domain and develop a replicable strategy across NRLM

Activity on going:

- SHRISTI setup a dedicated team for this particular intervention in the village and set up a camp office in the community to understand and build relations in the community
- On going the liasoning process with District & Block administration for Convergence with all Government Departments towards inclusive development of the community.
- House hold level Survey work completed in all hamlet by the help of local to identify the problem & understands the style of leaving.
- Adopting the community Institution by properly validation & regularized the schedule meeting at SHG as well as Hamlet level.
- Promoted Nutrition garden of the 6 hamlets in three villages with a objective to consumption purpose with the convergence of Horticulture department by providing plant support.
- We demonstrated some Income generation model on vegetable cultivation.
- Looking to their practices we distributed different varieties of millet seeds among beneficiaries to add nutrition value, accordingly POP will be shared to ensure good productivity.
- We arranged food festival in three hamlets for cooking process of "Dalma" by using Papaya in day to day food habit.
- To address the goat mortality ratio we ensure the Pneumonia vaccine and Ranikheta vaccine by arranging goat health camp with the convergence with vet nary department.
- COVID-19 awareness has done with the SHG and youth villagers by demonstrating the process of hand washing & social distancing and also provides mask support to the members.

We helped in free food cooking, re-immunization money to the Ration card, and Agri implement distribution to 5 hamlets.



(8) Rapid Community Response to COVID-19 (RCRC)

RCRC, India is a coalition of leading Civil Society Organizations through the length and breadth of the country. SHRISTI is one of those CSOs who carried out the survey of reverse migrants and helped them get their entitlements. The RCRC Centre for Monitoring Rural India carried out a household survey to understand the livelihood status, condition of migrants, and the efficacy of the government reach in the form of entitlements.

The survey analyzed the status of food security, hunger, and indebtedness. The impact on all farm livelihood options (production and sale) was studied. There was an inquiry into the mental wellbeing and access to health services. The survey is aimed at investigating the impact of the pandemic on a regular monthly basis.

Overall focus:

- Build community capabilities to address the immediate and medium-term effects of COVID-19 on health, well-being and livelihoods security
- Demonstrate a concerted, convergent planning approach to address the issues related to mass home-coming of migrant workers

The Humanitarian Aid project started by APPI and SHRISTI from the second week of June 2021 has been successfully completed with the active involvement, support and participation of representatives of Gram Panchayats, Women SHG (Self Help Group) and PG (Producers Group) leaders, BDO (Block Development officer) and CRPs/ERPs/GSPs (Community Resource Persons, External Resource persons, Goat Service Providers) and staff. All relief distribution data has been captured in the ODK developed by APPI.

Upon completion or full coverage of 1205 vulnerable families as per the sanction, additionally 150 ultra-poor families have been supported with dry ration, utilizing the available budget under the budget head of transport, packing and CRPs food expenses. All 1355 vulnerable tribal families are the most deserving families.

Our Approach against Covid-19:

Data of our work in Second wave of Covid-19:

- An excess of 150 families were served apart from 1355 vulnerable families.
- The amount saved from transport, packing and food was used to accommodate the expenses for these 150 extra vulnerable families helped.
- The procurement of items below budgeted amount through effective negotiations helped improve the reach of the relief.
